Bellingham At Home Service Area Defined

As we launch, our Village is available to everyone living within the Bellingham city limits and in much of the planned urban growth area for our city. The <u>map</u> on our website provides details. If you live outside our service area, you may choose to join as an Associate Member, which will give you access to our list of recommended service providers and to our social and educational activities.

Membership Process

Our Member Application and Agreement has been approved and is ready to use. Come to our <u>website</u> to download a PDF file that you can fill out on your computer and print (or print and complete by hand). Or call us (360) 746-3462 and ask us to mail a form to you. The application asks for contact information about you and anyone else in your household who wishes to join Bellingham At Home. When one person joins, others in the household can join for only \$50 per year per person. After we receive your completed form, along with your check, we will call you to schedule an interview in your home. The interview is an opportunity for you to get to know us and for us to get to know you. By understanding your needs and interests, we hope to better serve you. You will have ample opportunity to ask questions in this one-on-one interview.

We believe when you make someone else's life better, you make your own life better. Members are encouraged to participate as volunteers, too.

Volunteer Process

Three types of volunteers are needed to ensure the ongoing operation of the Village.

- Service volunteers work directly with members, providing transportation, helping-hand chores, and related assistance.
- Office volunteers (yes, we now have an office!) work closely with Village administrators, who are also volunteers. They answer phone calls and coordinate service requests.
- Task force volunteers build and sustain our virtual village. They train volunteers, interview new members, plan educational and social events, manage finances, do fundraising, and maintain continuous contact with our service provider businesses and strategic partners.

Volunteers need to complete an application and be vetted, interviewed and trained. The process is explained in more detail on our website. Every volunteer receives a copy of our volunteer handbook.

We Have an Office!

Bellingham At Home now has a physical base of operations. It's Room 17 at the Bellingham Senior Activity Center. Office hours are limited during pre-launch, but you'll find someone there between 11AM and 1PM. It will probably be a member of our Leadership Council until office volunteers step up to the task and receive training. Let us know if you'd like to help run the office. Many hands make light work!

If you want to submit a membership application, with a check, please deliver it to Room 17 at the Senior Center during our office hours (11AM-1PM). The front desk at BSAC is not prepared to accept Bellingham At Home applications or checks. Alternatively, we will accept checks and applications by regular mail (address below).
